A GOD WHO IS AMBIDEXTROUS

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The word ambidextrous simply means, someone who is able to use both hands with equal ease. Someone who is very skillful or versatile.

We've probably all heard about the right hand of God. The term "right hand" occurs in 169 verses in the Bible. It signifies power, pomp, preeminence, might, majesty, glory, grace, strength and so on. All of these things can be found at the right hand of God.

However, there might be times when you can't find God at the right hand. You might not feel the power, pomp, preeminence, might, majesty, glory, grace and strength.

But we serve a God who is ambidextrous! When you look to the right and can't find God, don't give up, keep looking. Look to the left, where He works!

Job 23:8-9 Behold, I go forward, but he is not there; and backward, but I cannot perceive him: On the left hand, where he doth work, but I cannot behold him: he hideth himself on the right hand, that I cannot see him:

Job said, "I go forward and he isn't there. I go backward and can't find him. On the right hand he is hiding himself, but on the left hand, he doth work."

There are times when we need God's power. There are times when we need His strength. There are times when we need His provision, but there are also times when more than anything else, we just need Him to work on our behalf.

You might be weak and weary, tired and tempted, confused and confounded. You might not be able to find God dwelling on the right hand, but look to the left hand, and watch Him work!

Have you ever tried to impress God with your power and your ability? God isn't easily impressed.

God's not looking for somebody to impress Him; He's looking for someone to please Him. He doesn't want us bragging about how good we are, He's looking for someone to talk about how good He is.

He is good and He is powerful and He can do more in 5 seconds than we can do in 50 years!

God doesn't need our talent, our ability, our knowledge, what God needs is for us to recognize who we are and acknowledge who He is. We are nothing and He is everything. It doesn't matter what we don't have, if we have Him, that is enough.
