I'm sure you've heard the phrase, "Happy New Year" a lot the past few days. We've said it and others have said it to us. But what does a Happy New Year really look like?

A good job? Health for your family? Money in the bank? Clothes in your closet?

Can we wish Happy New Year to someone with cancer? Is it appropriate to wish a Happy New Year to someone going through a divorce? How hollow does "Happy New Year" sound to someone who is unemployed? Is wishing someone a Happy New Year only for those who are "blessed?"

Matt 6:31-33 Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

Jesus told us not to worry about food, drink, clothes, etc. He said that's what the "sinners" do. "But seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness."
