

STANDING IN AWE OF THE HOLINESS OF GOD

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The word “holy” is found 611 times in the King James Bible. That sounds to me like it might be a subject that is important to God.

The first place that the word “holy” is found in Scripture is in Ex 3:5-6 “And he said, Draw not nigh hither: put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground. Moreover he said, I am the God of thy father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God.”

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Most people don't reverence the presence of God like they should.

Holiness by definition means to be separated and set apart, which is its purpose for us in our daily lives.

Isaiah had an encounter with God and it changed his life. He did not leave that encounter the same way that he was before he found himself in the presence of God.

Being in the presence of God should change us and if it doesn't, why doesn't it?

I'm afraid that the majority of the church world today is more concerned about their happiness than they are about God's holiness.

Most Christians want Jesus to take away all of their problems and to help them carry their heavy burdens but they aren't interested in Him taking over their lives and changing their hearts.

Heb 12:14 Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:

That sounds to me like holiness is important to the Lord. Without it, we won't see Him!

God is a holy God and He has called us to be a holy people and since we belong to Him, He has every right to tell us what to do and how to live.
